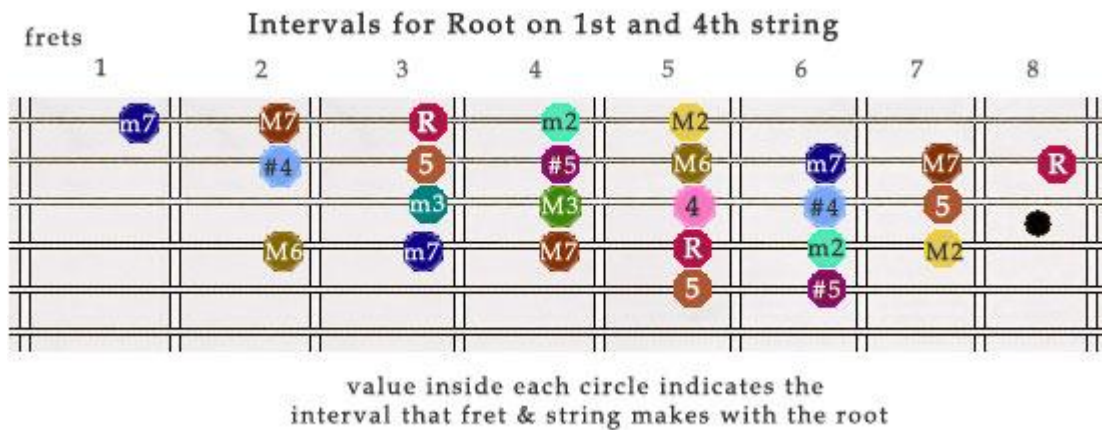
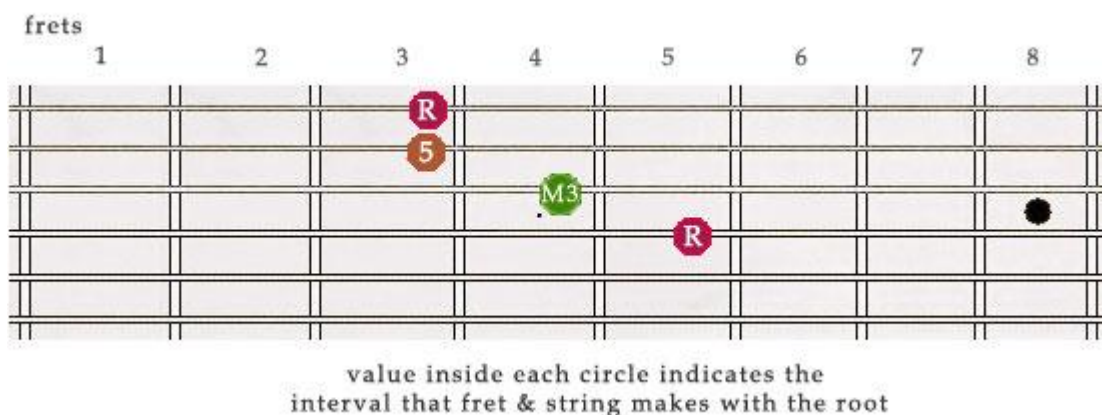


Intervals – String/ Frets

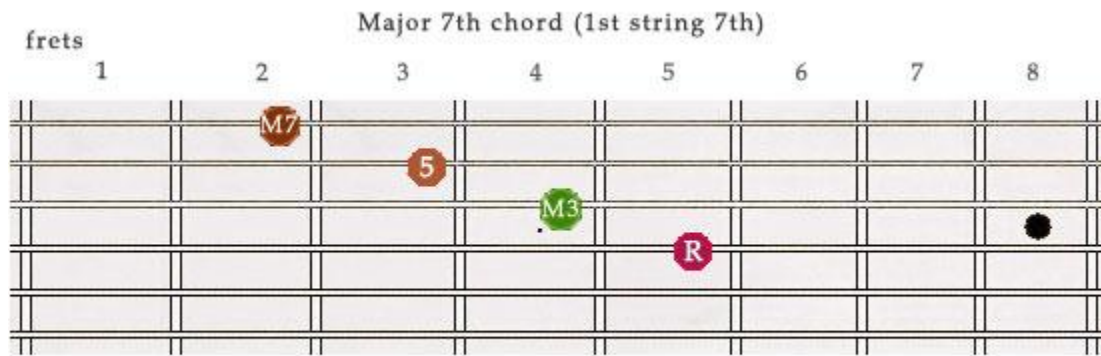


Above figure shows possible options of frets / strings where we can find all the intervals when the root is on the 4th string or 1st string. (Root on 1st string means the same fret on 6th string has the root also, since both 1st and 6th string notes are the same on any given fret)

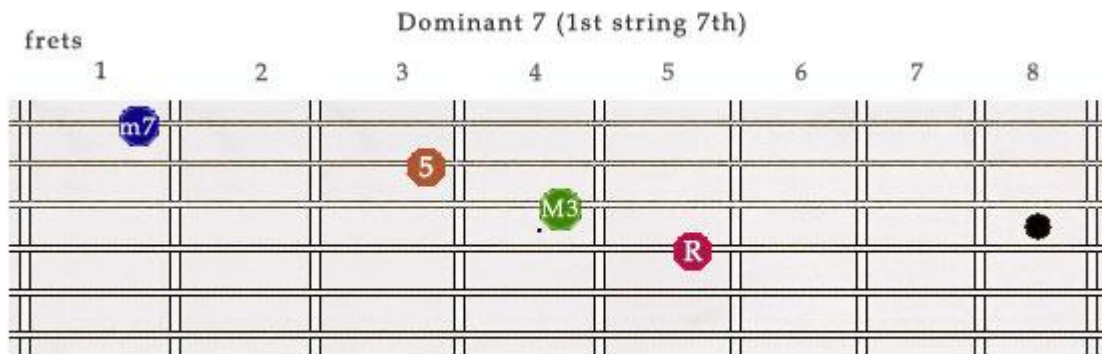
Major chord with root on 4th or 1st string



Changing notes on the 1st string



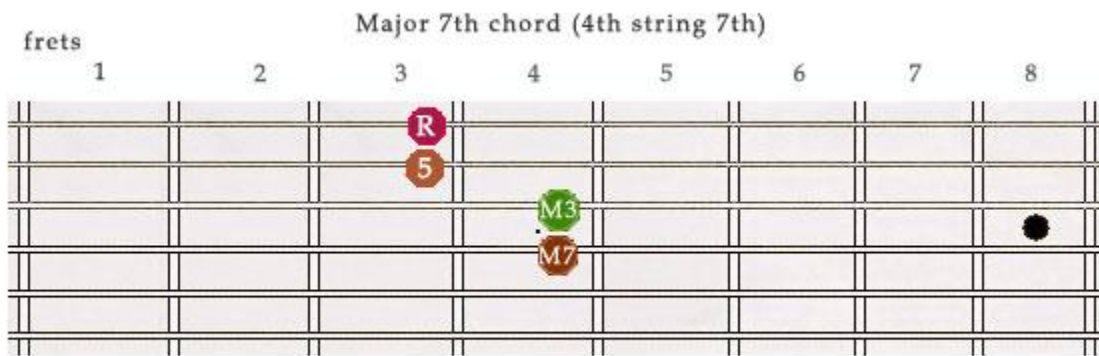
value inside each circle indicates the interval that fret & string makes with the root

value inside each circle indicates the interval that fret & string makes with the root

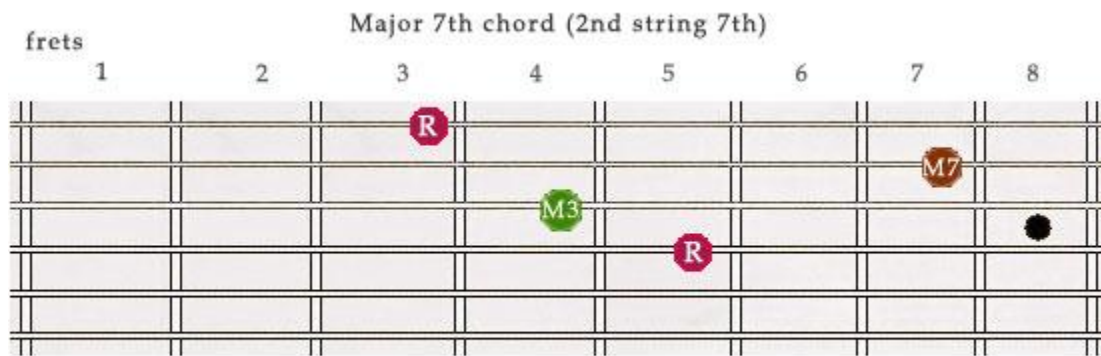

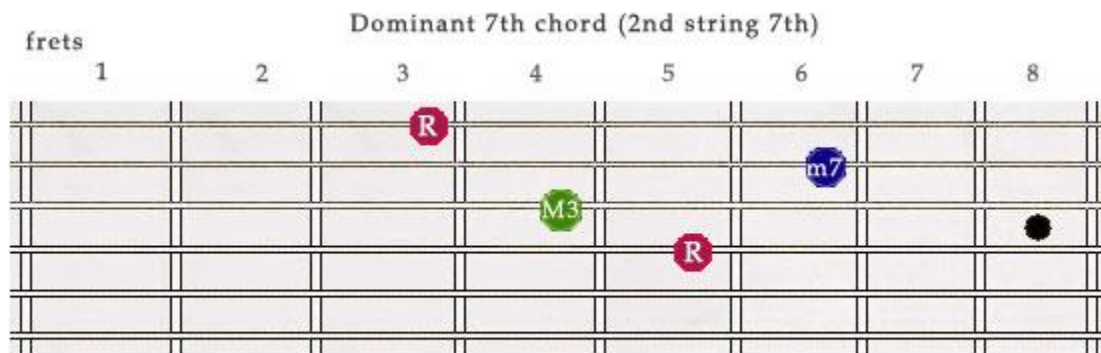

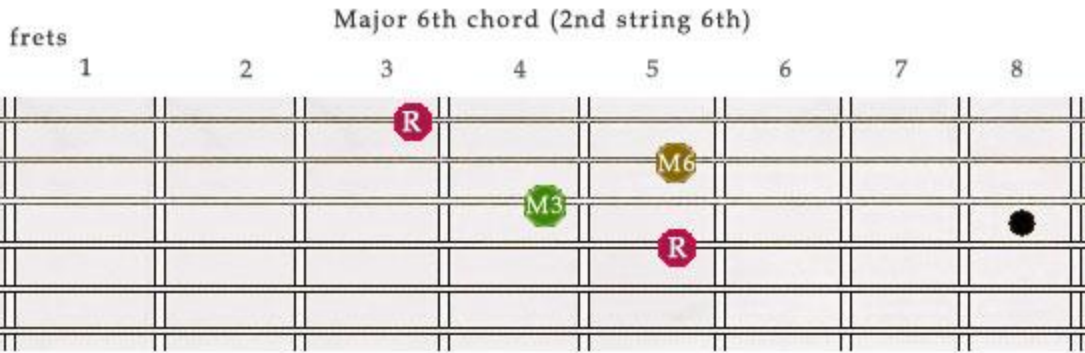
Changing notes on the 2nd string



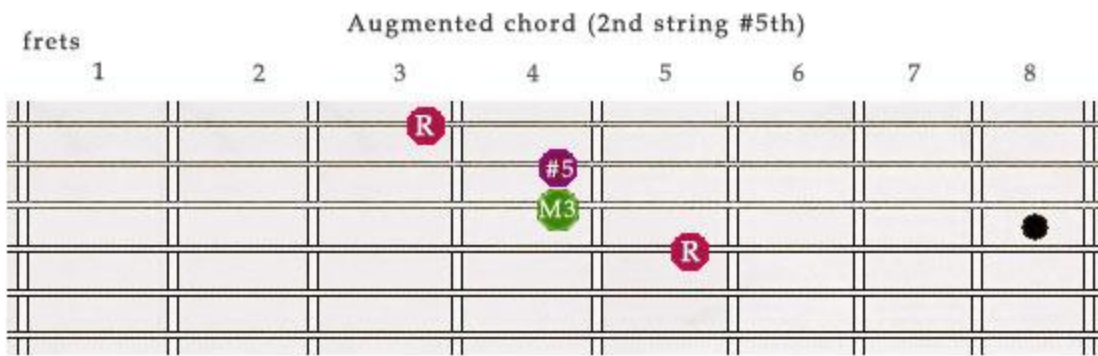
value inside each circle indicates the interval that fret & string makes with the root
